

Mobility Regulation of the Department

The Department of Photography and Audio Visual Arts must encourage and support in any way the mobility of both students and its staff to visit similar institutions of higher education or research institutes and organisations. The rules for the Erasmus programme are available on the Department's website <https://phaa.uniwa.gr/en/erasmus/>.

1. Erasmus+ programme (student mobility)

Based on bilateral agreements concluded between the University and institutions outside the EU, students of the Department can go to study in one of these institutions for a period of not less than 3 months or more than a year. The terms and conditions for participation are set out in detail on the website of the Erasmus section

2. Erasmus+ Traineeships Programme

The Department of International Relations/Erasmus+ of the UNIWA implements student's internship training activity within the framework of the European Erasmus+ Traineeship Programme. This programme is offered to students from all study cycles (undergraduates, postgraduates, doctoral candidates) and recent graduates of the UNIWA, the opportunity to carry out practical training, in institutions (e.g. companies, Non Governmental Organizations, Research Centres, Educational Institutions, diplomatic missions, etc.) based in European Union countries. The terms and conditions terms and conditions of participation are set out in detail on the Erasmus website.

3. Staff mobility programme for teaching and training

The teaching or combined teaching and training period may be last 2-5 working days. The programme is being implemented under the Erasmus+ programme in which partly covers travel and living expenses abroad.

4. Financial support for students participating in mobility programmes

The Erasmus+ programme provides students with a grant to cover the additional costs they will face, exemption from tuition fees abroad and recognition of the period of study spent at the foreign university.

5. Informing the academic community about the mobility programmes

The information of the academic community about the mobility programmes shall be made by posting relevant announcements on the Department's website, by a relevant entry in the Study Guide, by information given at the meetings of the Department, from newsletters published by the International Relations Office of the UNIWA as well as by means of e mails and the networking tools the Department provides.

6. Implementation of the credit transfer system (ECTS)

As mentioned above, the credit transfer system (ECTS) is applied by the Department in application of the relevant legislation (Government Gazette Vol.1446/13-8-2007). The number of ECTS per course is indicated in the Department's Study Guide. For the matching of the courses, which were held in cooperating universities with those of the Department's curriculum the Erasmus Academic Officer of the Department, in cooperation with the lecturer, are responsible to facilitate the transfer of the corresponding credits. In case of non-recognition of the course taught, the course shall be listed in the Diploma Annex in order to proof that it was successfully taught and examined at another University.
